



Recent Historical Background







Political Situation

In 1929, Imperial Japan, under the reign of Emperor Hirohito since 1926 following Emperor Taishō's passing, operated within a constitutional monarchy framework, wherein the emperor wielded symbolic authority while governance was entrusted to elected officials and a parliamentary system.^[6,17] The current Prime Minister was Osachi Hamaguchi, who governed Japan from 1929 to 1931. His administration grappled with economic challenges amidst global turbulence and decided to pursue economic reforms instead of military actions.^[18] The political landscape featured influential parties like Rikken Seiyūkai, advocating conservatism, Rikken Minseitō, championing liberal reforms, and Kokumin Dōmei, promoting nationalist expansionism and fascism.^[19,20,21] Japan's colonial policy towards territories such as Korea and Taiwan sparked tensions with minority groups, facing discrimination and oppression.^[8,22]

Economic Situation in 1929

Having massively ramped up its coal and raw silk production in the previous decades as well as its railroad coverage, Japan's economy was rapidly industrializing and increasing in importance. Other key sectors during that period included naval construction, the military industry as well as forestry and fishing.^[23] Japan's main trade partners at that time were the United States, the United Kingdom and India. Japan mainly imported cotton, wool and iron and exported wool articles, silk and rayon. During that period, Japan ran a slight trade deficit with imports being about 15% bigger than exports.^[24] Despite this strong economic showing, Japan faced regular economic and financial crises, especially in 1920, 1922, 1923 and culminating in 1927.^[25]

Military Strength in 1929

In 1929, the Japanese army was a well-equipped army boasting about 300'000 active personnel.^[26] It had about 20 tanks, imported from France and the United Kingdom^[27] and was in the process of developing its own military vehicles^[28,29] The Japanese Navy was very developed, using 217 ships, including 48 submarines and 106 destroyers^[30] It also had a very high amount of planes, totaling about 1900 for its Navy and 500 for its air service.^[31,32]

Allies/Enemies/Existing territorial disputes in 1929

Allies: Germany (improvement of relations in 1928)^[35], France (favored treatment of Japanese people in French Indochina)^[36]

Increasing Tensions: Britain (Deterioration of relations due to pressure of British dominions)^[37]

Enemies: Republic of China (Japan trying to secure its interests in China)^[38]; Soviet Union (Sakhalin Islands, Kuril Islands, Opposition to Soviet Communism)^[39]

Some of the main goals for the 1930s

- 1. Expansion of territory: Japan has sought to expand its territorial control in East Asia and the Pacific region, for instance in Manchuria.^[40]
- 2. Economic Dominance: Aim to establish economic dominance in East Asia through the acquisition of resources and the establishment of spheres of influence.
- 3. Maintain Political Influence and Hegemony by keeping control of Korea (Chōsen) and Taiwan.^[7,8]

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
